12th Annual Seton Hall Model United Nations Conference <u>FUN MUN Competitions^{*}</u>

There are several competitions being held at SHUMUN XII other than the debate^{**}.

<u>Competition 1 Rules</u>: This is an in-depth Parliamentary Procedure Exam for any delegate wishing to attempt. Those that score a 90% (63pts.) will receive recognition from the Senior Secretariat at the conference. Delegates wishing to compete must have their Advisor submit their Answer Sheet no later than the first Advisor Meeting of the day. Delegates can take as much time as they would like and can use the Parliamentary Procedure materials available but cannot ask for any help by friends, advisors, munners, or even parents. Please make sure delegates are honest; this is just for fun! (Difficulty: Challenging)

<u>Competition 2 Rules:</u> This is an essay tournament for all delegates that wish to participate. Essays should be no more than 200-300 words in length. Delegates should make sure to answer each of the questions provided in a concise manner and make sure it is a personal story of truth! Delegates are encouraged to type this essay and print it out; however neatly handwritten essays will be accepted. Advisors should have these ahead of time and submit them to the Senior Secretariat at the first Advisor Meeting. They may seek help; although they should be the primary writers. (Difficulty: Medium)

<u>Competition 3 Rules</u>: This is an essay tournament for all delegates that wish to participate. Essays should be no more than 200-300 words in length. Delegates should make sure to answer the questions in a concise manner. Delegates should be descriptive and creative and definitely unique in their choice. Delegates are encouraged to type this essay and print it out; however neatly handwritten essays will be accepted. Advisors should have these ahead of time and submit them to the Senior Secretariat at the first Advisor Meeting. Please may seek out help to complete this essay; although they should be the primary writers. (Difficulty: Medium)

Competition 4 Rules: This is a poetry contest for any delegates that wish to participate. Poems may range from limericks to haikus and free verse to iambic pentameter. All delegates should have their Advisors hand in their poetry submissions by the first Advisor Meeting. Delegates may seek out any help they chose, but are to make sure that they are the one that comes up with content and voice. (Difficulty: Medium)

<u>Competition 5 Rules:</u> This competition is pretty self-explanatory. A delegate designs a new flag for the organization in which they are debating. Write their name, school, committee, and country on the back. They may use any means to write this / create it, but should make it original. Submissions are due by the first Advisor Meeting. (Difficulty: Beginner)

<u>Competition 6 Rules</u>: Delegates are to come up with a crisis update for a Security Council Simulation. They are able to decide the topic of their choice. This update is to be realistic as well as very creative. This is a harder competition and should be attempted by those experienced delegates that have already been in a crisis committee. (Difficulty: Challenging)
